

A. Turf Weed I.D. and Management. Identify and learn management techniques for turf weeds and weedy grasses during a walking tour.

Instructors: Tony Koski, Extension Turfgrass Specialist and Sarah Wilhelm, Research Associate, Department of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture. (30 people)

B. Current Plant Diseases. Recognition of plant diseases pose a challenge? Learn some tricks of the trade for quicker, more accurate disease diagnosis using hand lenses and visual observations.

Instructor: Laura Pottorff, Extension Commercial Greenhouse Specialist, Adams County and Mary Small, Jefferson County Plant Diagnostic Clinic. (30 people)

C. Structural Pruning. Learn the proper pruning basics to allow plants to have proper structure and taper. Class will include classroom instruction as well as outdoor observation.

Instructor: David Whiting, Extension Consumer Horticulture Specialist, Department of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture. (40 people)

D. Storm Damage Pruning. Learn how trees and evergreens should be pruned in light of the recent storms. Class will include pruning demonstrations of recently damaged trees and evergreens. Pruning after regrowth will also be discussed.

Instructors: Dave Sexton, City of Fort Collins, Forestry Division and Ryan Baldwin of Arborworks. (25 people)

E. Irrigation Basics. Learn about irrigation systems that water plants effectively and efficiently, and how to retrofit what customers already have.

Instructors: Carl Wilson, Denver County Cooperative Extension and Dave Cooper, CPS Distributor Inc., Denver. (30 people)

F. Irrigation Audits. This will be a two-session program (3 hours of training) where you will learn the principles and techniques to do irrigation audits.

G. Irrigation Techniques and Equipment. Demonstrations with weather stations, ET controllers, subsurface drip and more.

Instructors: Brent Mecham, Northern Colorado Water Conservancy District, Loveland and John Keesen, Keesen Water Management, Inc., Denver. (25 people)

H. New Clones of Shade/Ornamental Trees. Learn and observe newer clones of maple, ash, linden, oak and many other ornamental trees. Clones of deciduous trees introduced in the last 20 years will be discussed and observed firsthand in a new arboretum site.

Instructors: James E. Klett, Extension Landscape Horticulturist, Department of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture and Gary Epstein, Fort Collins Wholesale Nursery. (25 people)

I. Xeric Annuals and Perennials. Learn and observe xeric annuals and perennials including many of the "X-rated" plants listed by Garden Centers of Colorado. Also, observe firsthand a water requirement study on 20 common annual flowers.

J. Native Plants for the Landscape. Learn the identification, culture, and maintenance of many of our native plants found in residential and commercial landscapes.

K. Landscape Insect Walk. Get a firsthand look at recognition and management of insect pests in the field during a walking tour of Colorado State University campus grounds.

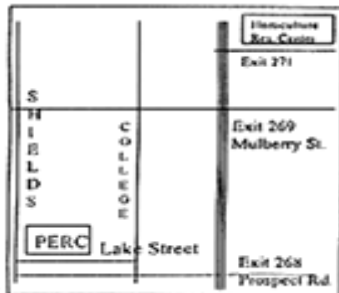
